We sensitised them in good hygiene and the essence of education. We donated sanitary pads, under wears and sensitised them on how to properly use and wear these items.



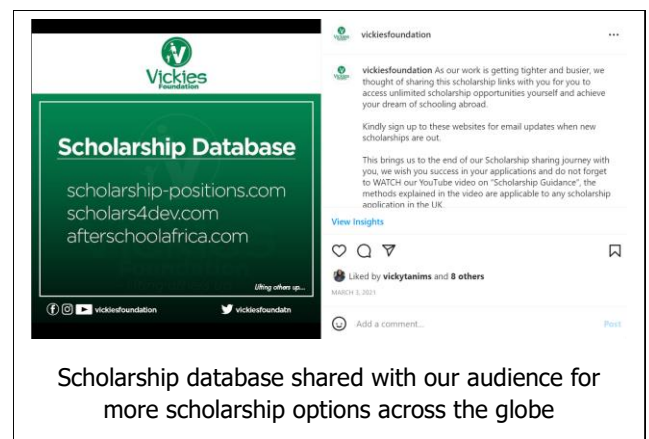
Exposure to Scholarship Opportunities
